The AIM of the Association is to consolidate the spirit of good fellowship and to continue to take pride in the Squadron's past and present achievements.

43(F) Squadron (Fighting Cocks) Association was founded in 1945 , immediately after the end of the war. Some of the ground crew had been together for nearly four years.

They decided that the spirit and comradeship that had built up between all the personnel - Officers - Non Commissioned Officers - Airmen - Ground Crew and Aircrew should not be lost.

The Association was formed at Klagenfurt in Austria where the Squadron was based from May 11th 1945 until 24th September 1946. The founder members of the Association were Flight Sergeant Jimmy Beedle, Sergeant Frank Wooley, Sergeant "Pip" Reading , Sergeant "Vic" Vickers, Flight Sergeant Len Telling.
